

## ORDINANCES 2017

- 001-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover authorizing the installation and maintenance of a stop sign on the east side of Ridge Street at the intersection of Solomon Street in the Township of Hanover.
- 002-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover granting a 10 foot public utility right of way to UGI Penn Natural Gas, Inc. along Harrison Street for approximately 210 feet on land owned by the Township for the extension construction and maintenance of a natural gas pipeline.
- 003-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover approving authorizing the sale of the Township's Storage Building at the end of Delaney Street near the levee to the Luzerne County Flood Protection Authority for the sum of \$7,500.00.
- 004-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover adopting and approving an amendment to the articles of incorporation of the Wyoming Valley Sanitary Authority to further provide for stormwater system planning, management and implementation, and to extend the term of existence of the Authority as proposed by Resolution of the Board of said Authority; setting forth such proposed amendment; authorizing said authority and proper officers thereof to execute, verify and file appropriate articles of amendment; and repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith.
- 005-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover approving an intergovernmental cooperation agreement with the Wyoming Valley Sanitary Authority for the creation and implementation of the Wyoming Valley Regional Stormwater Management Program.
- 006-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover accepting and approving an intergovernmental agreement between Hanover Township and Warrior Run Borough for Fire Protection Services within Warrior Run Borough.

- 007-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover establishing one way traffic on spring street in a eastwardly direction from the intersection of Halliday Court to Hazle Street in Hanover Township and authorizing the installation and maintenance of the appropriate signs.
- 008-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover in the County of Luzerne, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, appropriating specific sums estimated to be required for the specific purposes of the Municipal Government, hereinafter, set forth, during the year 2018.
- 009-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover, County of Luzerne, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania fixing the tax rate for the year 2018 at 5.5 MILLS.
- 0110-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover, County of Luzerne, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania imposing a realty transfer tax of one (1%) per centum for the year 2018.
- 011-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover, County of Luzerne, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania imposing an earned income tax of one (1%) per centum for the year of 2018.
- 012-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover, County of Luzerne, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania imposing a mercantile and business privilege tax.
- 013-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover imposing a local service tax for the year 2018 in the amount of fifty two (\$52.00) dollars on the privilege of engaging in an occupation within the Township pursuant to Act 7 of 2007 and Ordinance 005-2007, the Hanover Township Local Service Tax.
- 014-2017 An Ordinance of the Township of Hanover establishing a Local Economic Revitalization Tax Assistance (LERTA) program within the Township of Hanover located on approximately 271-97 Acres of land known as the Earth Conservancy Hanover 9 Site in Hanover Township, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania bounded generally by State Route 29/South Cross Valley

Expressway, Middle Road/South Main Street, the border with the City of Nanticoke and the Sans Souci Parkway/East Main Street, Hanover Township, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania.

015-2017 2017 Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance

016-2017 An Ordinance of Board of Commissioners of the Township of Hanover, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, setting forth its intent to issue its General Obligation Bond, Series of 2017, in the maximum principal amount of two million two hundred eighteen thousand dollars (\$2,218,000.00) pursuant to the Act of The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 53 PA.C.S. Chapters 80-82, as amended, reenacted and supplemented, known as the Local Government Unit Debt Act (The "Act"); finding that a private sale by negotiation is in the best financial interest of the Township, determining that such bond shall evidence non electoral debt of the Township specifying that such indebtedness is to be incurred to provide funds to finance a project of the Township which consists of among other things: (1) refunding the Township's outstanding acquiring, constructing, installing, furnishing and equipping of alterations, renovations, additions and improvements to the fire station of the Township; (3) additional capital projects of the Township to the extent approved by the Board of Commissioners of the Township; and (4) paying the costs and expenses of issuing the bond; setting forth the reasonable estimated useful lives of the capital projects to be financed and refinanced by the bond; accepting a proposal for the purchase of such bond at private sale by negotiation; providing that such bond, when issued, shall constitute a General Obligation of the Township; fixing the denomination, dated date, interest payment dates, interest rates, redemption provisions and place of payment of the principal of an interest on such bond; authorizing specified officers of the township to contract with the paying agent for its services in connection with the bond; setting forth the substantial form of the bond evidencing the debt; authorizing execution and attestation of such bond; providing covenants related to debt service applicable to such bond to the extent required by the act and pledging the full faith, credit and taxing power of the Township to support thereof; creating a sinking fund in connection with such bond, to the extent required by the Act; designating the paying agent to be the sinking fund depositor; providing a covenant to insure prompt and full

payment for such bond when due; setting forth registration and transfer provisions with respect to such bond; authorizing the execution of one or more investment agreements by specified officers of the Township (if applicable) and the purchase of certain U.S. Treasury Obligations or any other securities or investments in connection with the project and the refunding of the Township's Outstanding General Obligation Note, series A of 2016; authorizing and directing specified officers of the Township to do, to take and to perform certain specified, required, necessary or appropriate acts to the preparation of a debt statement and borrowing base certificate, and the filing of specified documents with the Department of Community and Economic Development, all as required by the ACT; declaring that the debt to be evidenced by such bond, together with all other indebtedness of the Township, will not be in excess of any applicable limitation. Imposed by the ACT; authorizing proper officers of the Township to deliver the bond upon the approval of the Department of Community and Economic Development; setting forth certain covenants precluding the Township from taking actions which would cause the bond to become an "arbitrage bond" or a "private activity bond" as those terms are used in the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "CODE"), and applicable as a "Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligation" under Section 265(b) of the CODE; providing when this ordinance shall become effective; providing for severability of provisions; and repealing all ordinances or parts of Ordinances insofar as the same shall be inconsistent herewith.
